- The Iowa Nurse Assistance Program (INAP) asked:

"I was wondering if I could run a scenario by you as one state Board to another. We would like to make sure we are somewhat in line with what other programs in the country are doing. We have a nurse seeking entry into the program and they have a medical cannabidiol card. Marijuana is still illegal in Iowa unless you have a medical card. She uses a vape with THC nightly. Is this something you would allow in your program? We have not allowed this in the past, but it hasn't come up much until now and the full committee will be reviewing this again soon. I would like to be able to send along a few instances of what is going on in other states."

Discussion: The use of medical marijuana has not been permitted due to its abuse potential and the fact that it is not a prescription medication. John added that prescription medications such as Cannabidiol and Dronabinol may be considered when there is a clear medical need and other interventions are not successful.

 Committee projects: As the Basic Drug Test Panel and Core Measure Set projects should be completed in the next few months the committee was asked to start thinking about new committee projects
